



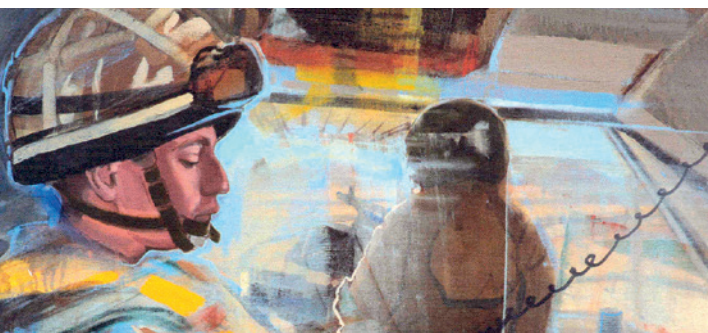
DRAWN TO DANGER
